LIBERTY Mo. – The Liberty Parks and Recreation Department has partnered with Clay County Senior Services and the Senior Learning Network (SLN) to provide free interactive, educational seminars streamed online, which are designed specifically for mature adults.

Sept. 24, 10:30-11:30 a.m. - Conversation with Elder Care Attorney Ramsey Bahrawy

Bahrawy believes in the power of education and the need to pass this knowledge onto others. He is heavily involved in his community, teaching seniors the proper way to manage living arrangements, life insurance, wills communication, storage of important documents and much more. Bahrawy is an Adjunct Professor of Business Ethics, Business Law and Regulations at Merrimack College in North Andover, Mass.

Oct. 6, 10:30-11:30 a.m. - A Virtual Tour: Collecting Words of Wisdom with Lynne Beachner, Co-founder of SLN

We often think of things that could be important for our children to know - just little things that we have learned throughout life. Do we stop and write them down? No, not usually! SLN is conducting a virtual tour to collect these "pearls of wisdom" from individuals. What do you want to pass on to the next generation? What are the important life lessons you have learned? SLN will compile a digital book that will be made available to all participating centers.

Dec. 17, 10:30-11:30 a.m. - The Dangers in National Parks offered by Brown Museum National Park Service

Explore some of the most beautiful places in the world, as well as some of the most deadly: America's National Parks. Although most visitors recognize the inherent dangers in exploring national parks, some are ignorant of the potential life threatening situations that can occur.

Ranger David Smith is a 20-year veteran of the National Park Service and will share stories and images from some of the truly awe-inspiring places he has worked. The program will highlight Grand Canyon, Arches, Joshua Tree, Canyonland's National Parks and touch on many of the other parks in the National Park Service system.

Participants will be able to submit questions to presenters live and in real time. All of the programs will be streamed from the Blue Room at the Liberty Community Center, and are free and open to the public.

The SLN recognizes the continuous learning needs of retired citizens and has developed on-going educational programming to keep older adults engaged.
